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College has constituted IQAC since 2017-18 to achieve the goals of college through assessment and quality enhancement. Keeping in view the goal of achieving quality, college has focused on initiatives that are always improving the functioning of overall activities. Keeping in mind striving for achieving good recognition college has tried to develop a system that included planning, monitoring and record keeping of activities. IQAC involved in enhancing quality in the sense of upgradation of overall performance of college through various best initiatives.

Keeping track of quality initiatives IQAC suggested upgradation of courses alongside B.Pharm. Looking at the importance of pharmacy person in healthcare system like hospitals, medical stores, pharmaceutical industry, a proposal was put forth by IQAC and Dayanand Education Society in its executive meeting held on 13-01-2018 passed a resolution to apply to AICTE for start of short term two years Diploma course in Pharmacy (D.Pharm) from academic year 2018-19. In wake of this step college has applied to Government of Maharashtra and received sanctioning of intake 60 students for the same on 23rd May 2018.

Keeping in view further expansion of educational development in pharmacy education and research, IQAC has given input during 2019-20 to start Post Graduation (PG) courses. Keeping follow up with same college applied for approval to start post-graduation M.Pharm course in two streams Pharmaceutics and Quality Assurance Technology (QAT). College received permission from Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), New Delhi on 19th July 2021 to start PG courses from academic year 2021-22.

The aim of industrial visit is to provide an exposure to students about practical working environment .They also provide students a good opportunity to gain full awareness about industrial practices. Through industrial visit students get awareness about new Technology.

The institute organize the industrial visit every year with national and International pharmaceutical industry and also depute the student for training in pharm Industry. Institute will regularly arrange the expert talk of industry personal.

Achievements:

As per the strategy and goal envisaged by the management to drive the educational policies in the college keeping in mind development of the students in co-curricular and extracurricular aspects with prime importance to the academic excellence. Perspective plan was drawn in accordance with the academic aspects for five years (2017-18 to 2021-22) and accordingly the activities are planned to improve important stakeholders' performance i.e. students. Looking at present scenario college has developed a robust, convincing and result oriented system for the academic growth of students. There is proper planning about execution of academic schedule given in Timetable and academic calendar.

This fact is exemplified by the success of the students at various levels of academic performances. Such as in last few years because of the continuous efforts of the GPAT cell more and more students are getting qualified for the GPAT. Out of these few candidates are even qualifying national level entrance for PG courses at National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER), central government research institutes for pharmacy research. This proves growing strong alumni base for college.

Not only this even in semester examination our final year students are procuring university rankings at Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. In 2019-2020 even our students Miss. Pratima Kendre with CGPA 9.91 and Ms. Somani with CGPA 9.64 has grabbed first and second rankings in the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. Following year in 2020-21 Miss. Gurme Supriya secured First rank. This is a result of continuous efforts of principal and teaching faculties at college to excel in academic aspects including proper delivery of lecture, follow up of students' progress, focus of teachers on solving subject difficulties of students.

To increase performance of students and counselling at personal level Mentor-Mentee scheme was effectively implemented in the college which has resulted in academic development. On co-curricular aspect college always strived to give students exposure to cocurricular activities like poster presentation, oral presentation, scientific model making competition and Avishkar participation.

In 2018-19 third year students Raj Shengar and Laxman Shukla represented college in Avishkar (Shri Ramanand Teerth University level research project competition), even many students have taken participation in poster presentation in conferences and workshops grabbing prizes. In this way students are getting exposure and interaction with different skilled persons from pharma industry and academia during these cocurricular activities. In view of getting practical Exposure College organizes field visits to medicinal gardens, industrial visit and as a part of curriculum they are compulsorily allowed to go through one month in plant industrial training, for same purpose college has collaborated with Shodh Advantech, a training institute, situated at Aurangabad.

Overall College is looking at holistic growth of students. NSS unit of college is organizing different social visits and programs so that students can learn social awareness. Even college follows Mentor-Mentee scheme for continuous counselling, encouragement, assessment of attendance and guidance about academic subjects by mentor teacher.

Similarly with assessment of students as slow and advanced learner based on their performance in internal sessional examination helps to identify slow learners who may need remedial coaching and advanced learners are directed to further progress in GPAT exam required for PG admission or to promote students to participate in oral or poster presentation in different

conferences. In wake of well-executed plan to keep faculty and students in current scenario with outer world, college arranges variety of seminars, webinars, conferences and workshops.
